



When visiting our stunning region by either car, train or bike, traveling around and exploring the area can be done by using one of the major roads, rail or highway networks. Alternatively, you can slow down a bit, explore the backroads and 'take the road less travelled' to see what adventures you may discover along the way!

Railway stations are located in the townships of Avenel, Euroa, Nagambie, Seymour and Violet Town, (check out the VLine or PTV website for timetable details) or by car you can travel straight up the Hume Freeway and connect with the Goulburn Valley Highway.

Our region has earned a reputation as an outstanding area for both breeding and training horses, and it is the **Birthplace of a Legend – Black Caviar**. Now immortalised in bronze in the heart of Nagambie, visitors can admire the power of Black Caviar in full flight, and learn more about her story at the **Nagambie Visitor Information Centre** just next door.

In Honouring Our Heroes, Strathbogie Shire is the birthplace of not one but three Victoria Cross recipients – Australia and the British Commonwealth's highest award for acts of bravery in wartime. As only 100 were awarded nationwide to Australians at war since 1854, this makes our region a place of considerable historical and military significance, and a memorial to honour Leslie Maygar, Frederick Tubb and Alex Burton can be found in Seven Creeks parkland at the Euroa RSL.

If it's **great wine** and **gourmet produce** that you're after, this region has plenty on offer with award winning wineries, eclectic eateries and magnificent markets all waiting to be explored.





Once an important coach stop for **Cobb & Co** on the route from Melbourne to Albury and for drovers and travellers to the goldfields in the north, Avenel also boasts one of provincial Victoria's most impressive bridges in the six-arch, stone crossing of Hughes Creek which was built by Hugh Dalrymple in 1850 and originally had a tollgate and toll keepers Cottage nearby.

As well as being well known for the high quality wool the area produces, Avenel plays an important role in the legend of the infamous Australian bushranger, **Ned Kelly**, who spent his childhood living in the town and also attended the local primary school.

Nestled along the Hume Highway and with regular trains up to Albury or down to Melbourne, Avenel is now a bustling township with an ever growing population and hot spot for people looking for a simpler life and idyllic for a relocation or weekender with its cosy sights, small town comforts and connectivity to the region.

LOCAL HIGHLIGHTS

Explore

Stroll or cycle around town, taking in the historical walk and sign posted significant buildings, and be sure to cross over the historic HughesCreek Bridge. The Avenel Cemetery is the final resting place of John 'Red' Kelly, the father of the bushranger Ned Kelly, making the area an integral part of the Ned Kelly Touring Route.

Indulge

Invest in a visit to Bank Street Pizza, housed in a former bank this popular spot is renowned for their wood fired pizza. Just next door you can enjoy one of the many award winning wines from the region at the historical Harvest Home. Mingle with the locals at either the Avenel Hotel or Daily Dose Cafe, then wander out to enjoy the award winning Fowles Wine Restaurant & Cellar Door and sample a glass of the iconic Ladies who Shoot their Lunch wines.


Enjoy a boutique stay in the 1870's icon of the Harvest Home, which retains its original eccentric charm and the essence of bohemian, art nouveau luxury.







- A young Ned Kelly saved a boy from drowning just downstream of the Hughes Creek Bridge in Avenel, for which he was awarded a green silk sash by the boy's parents. Ned was wearing this when he was captured at the Siege of Glenrowan.
- Avenel's Post Office opened on 2 June 1858 and the Avenel Primary School is No.8 in Victoria.
- Stewart Park is the perfect place to enjoy a picnic and look for the Aboriginal scar trees of the Taungurung people





of the area.

Visited by Hume and Hovell in 1824 and also by Thomas Mitchell in 1837, Euroa grew up on the sheep's back after Squatters took up runs in the district in 1838. It was at Seven Creeks that the first fine-wool Saxon merino sheep in Victoria were introduced in 1851.

Queen Victoria's era. Several of these buildings are located close to the main shopping precinct of Binney Street, with others located in Kirkland Avenue, Clifton and Railways Streets.

Historical buildings, Veteran memorials, great eateries, walks and trails as well as a page in the Kelly Gang story make Euroa worth the visit!

Explore

Discover the Euroa Arboretum which offers a unique experience to spend time in the natural environment of north-eastern Victoria. Walk your dog, take a bike ride, admire local artwork and fish for trout, and learn more about the Taungurung who are the Traditional Owners the land - it is much more than a recreational park. Step through history at the Farmers Arms Museum where you can learn about Eliza Forlonge who was an amazing pioneer women way ahead of her time, as well as view a fascinating collection of historical artefacts! Walk Euroa's Heritage Trail and be led to all the significant buildings and places which have played their role in creating such a colourful picture of Euroa's fascinating history.

Visit The Nest where you can enjoy a coffee and something from their light menu as well as browsing their fresh blooms! Across the street is Mawson's Bakery and Café where the vanilla slice is award winning! Enjoy cakes, pies, slices and all their other innovative creations.

Shop


Stay

- Euroa is the location of a Kelly Gang bank robbery. In 1878 Ned, Dan Kelly and Steve Hart robbed the Euroa Bank, making off with £2000 in cash and gold.
- 'Euroa' is said to come from the indigenous Ngurelban tribe language, from the word 'Yera-o' meaning 'joyful'.
- Euroa is home to three Victoria Cross recipients, and there is a memorial next to the RSL in Kirkland Ave named in their honour.
- AFL superstar, Collingwood player Jamie Elliot lived in Euroa as a teen and played for the Murray Bushrangers.

Sitting halfway between Heathcote and Nagambie, and surrounded by Ironbark Forest, is Graytown. Formally known as Spring Creek and initially surveyed in 1848, it wasn't until 20 years later when **gold was discovered**, that Graytown exploded with 2,000 residents arriving in the following weeks. Between 1868 and 1870, Graytown enjoyed a population of 30,000, similar to Ballarat at the time, and an 1871 census recorded 511 buildings in the area.

In 1870 a freak storm hit Graytown and Spring Creek, along with neighbouring creeks, overflowed and flooded many of the mineshafts. The storm was so sudden that if it had arrived during the day, many miners would have lost their lives. The water was too much to deal with, gold was left, and the town was abandoned.

The forest has claimed much of the site that was once home to one of **Victoria's biggest and shortest-lived gold rushes.** Still a place of interest for adventurers with prospecting and fossicking still permitted in **Heathcote-Graytown National Park.** Dating back thousands of years, the box-ironbark forest has been closely associated with providing food and shelter to the Aboriginal people of the region, and significant sites can be found throughout the area.

The National Park is ideal for bushwalkers and explorers with Mt Ida and Mt Black, the highest point in the area, and Viewing Rock providing stunning views of Heathcote and surrounding areas. There are 26 threatened fauna species and 9 threatened flora species that call the National Park home. A visit during August – October will reward you with an array of many beautiful wildflowers. LOCAL HIGHLIGHTS

Explore

Graytown's historic cemetery is still in remarkably good condition. It is set in the forest approx. 700m off the main road. The German Heritage Society and interested locals have been helping with restoration over the years. During World War II, prisoners of war were camped at Graytown. The prisoners were guarded at night in the POW Camp but able to work in the forest during the day and many of these men settled in the district after the war.

Stay

Camping the night? Head to Dargile camping and picnic area for a night under the stars!

- The historic Graytown cemetery features a Chinese burial section; a marble headstone dated in the early 1870s with text written in Welsh and numerous other headstones with inscriptions.
- After the initial gold rush, lack of water became a significant issue. To solve the problem of buying expensive water, many prospectors started washing their gold in beer, which was in abundant supply and was much cheaper!
- During World War II, prisoners of war were camped at Graytown with approx. 250 Italian and German prisoners of war detained there and the remains of the POW Camp still exist today.









Longwood's history dates back to the mid to late 1800's and it was originally located on the old Sydney to Melbourne Highway (now known as the Hume Highway), serving as a staging post for the horse-drawn coaches. The town then moved east by about 4km when the railway was built and a station was established at Longwood back in 1881, and the local school that is still in operation, was established in 1888.

Longwood is also the host of the **Victorian Carriage Driving Championships** held in November. Carriage driving in Australia ranges from the elegance of drivers, their gleaming horses and ponies and traditional vehicles in the show ring to all the action of combined driving and a lot more in between.

Sport, as with many country towns is the glue that binds the community – so grab a spot on the boundary with the locals on a winters Saturday afternoon and enjoy the action – tooting your horn for a goal scored is de rigueur!


Explore

The Rockery Gemstone Museum houses nine rooms to explore and features a unique collection of intriguing gems, crystals and minerals from Australia and all around the world, including an impressive collection of jewellery, most of which is for sale.

- When the railway was constructed in town back in the 1800's, rather than build a new pub nearby the new track, the locals simply picked up the existing Pub and moved it closer!
- Longwood is home to one of the finest range of gemstones in Victoria, located at The Rockery Gemstone Museum.
- Longwood is also the birthplace
 of Frederick Tubb, who was
 awarded a Victoria Cross at
 Gallipoli in 1915. Frederick Tubb
 is one of three from the area to
 have been awarded the Victoria
 Cross Australia & the British
 Commonwealth's highest award
 for acts of bravery in wartime,
 and a memorial to him and the
 other Victoria Cross recipients
 from the area is located in the
 township of Euroa just up the
 road!









On the banks of the **Goulburn River** and the shores of **Lake Nagambie** sits the township of Nagambie. With official settlement occurring in the 1800's, the town has become a haven for young families and the 'young at heart' to both holiday and reside, due to its close proximity to Melbourne (only 90 minutes away), natural beauty, **laid back lifestyle** and array of experiences on offer.

Turning water into wine, **two of Victoria's premium wineries** are nearby. Tahbilk Estate, established in 1860 – Victoria's oldest family owned winery is home to some of the oldest Shiraz and Marsanne vines in the world, as well as having buildings and surrounds much unchanged from its early days.

Further down the Goulburn River and accessible by both road and boat is Mitchelton Wines, with its distinctive & impressive tower and lookout designed by renowned Australian architect Ted Ashton, it is also home to a **4 star luxury hotel** and day spa, and Aboriginal Art Gallery.

There is something for everyone in Nagambie, from historic areas, fishing, tracks and trails, cycling, water sports, skydiving opportunities, monthly community markets, eateries, shopping and so much more. If you're looking for a day trip, weekend escape, event location or tree change – come and visit Nagambie!





LOCAL HIGHLIGHTS

Explore

Walk along the Lake Nagambie boardwalk and visit the soft sand at the hidden gem that is Elloura Beach. See the lake and river from the deck of the Goulburn Explorer boat which travels under the historic Chinaman's Bridge between Mitchelton and Tahbilk wineries or hire a boat and explore at your leisure with Nagambie Lakes Boat Hire. View the Black Caviar Statue in the main street, then discover another time at the Nagambie Historical Society.

Indulge

Experience the spectacular afternoon sun or evening sunset on the pet friendly deck of The Nagambie Brewery and Distillery, while enjoying a wood fired pizza with a local brew, or satisfy your coffee craving at Ma Forbes Kitchen. The winery at Mitchelton is also a must visit, featuring cellar door, Day Spa, The Muse Restaurant, and Aboriginal Art Gallery. Visit Victoria's oldest family owned winery - Tahbilk Winery and after lunch enjoy a walk amongst the wetlands and learn about their 'green' ethos. 




Live like a local in Ruffy


Explore






From 1842 squatters took up huge land holdings in the rugged Strathbogie Ranges and the tablelands to run thousands of sheep and cattle. Families arrived in the 1870's, and dairy and sheep were the driving industries in Strathbogie's early days and in the gold rush of the 1860's there were hundreds working the mines in the area. A second mining boom occurred in the 1940's with crystal mining to satisfy the quartz crystal component of early radios – crystal sets.

Vineyards have now replaced cattle, sheep and mining as the prime business pursuit of the Strathbogie region as savvy growers and winemakers take advantage of the cool climate and rich granite soils of the area. Surrounded by forests, farmland and striking granite hills the **environment is beautiful** with its native bushland, birds and animals.

The 'Bogies' as the ranges are often referred to is also a great **destination for bushwalkers and cyclists** and home to countless walks and scenic rides. Mt Wombat lookout offers excellent 360 degree views of the area from the plateau on top of Mt Wombat (799 metres), alternatively you can park halfway up and enjoy a pleasant walk.



LOCAL HIGHLIGHTS

Explore

Take in the incredible view from the Mount Wombat walk and lookout. The summit offers an amazing 360 degree view. Or walk the lovely Bridge to Bridge track and take in the beauty of this area.

Play

The favourite local swimming spot is Polly McQuinns, where the water spills over large exposed granite boulders and across a natural spillway into a deep water pool and makes it a great place to cool down on a hot day, or visit Gooram Falls just down the road.

- The Waranga Basin and Goulburn Weir at Nagambie are both visible from the Mount Wombat lookout.
- The largest hand cut-crystal in the world was mined at the local Crystal King mine.
- Strathbogie Township wasn't connected to mainstream electricity until 1966.








The famous explorer, Major Thomas Mitchell first discovered the area when travelling to Sydney, setting camp in 1836 beside some ponds (Honeysuckle Creek) where wild violets were in flower –he so named the spot Violet Ponds. Two years later the government laid out the village of 'Violet Creek', intending to develop a stopping point for the growing traffic on the road between Port Phillip and Yass in New South Wales. In another first, Violet Town was also the first town to have gas lighting in Victoria.

In 1969, **The Southern Aurora** overnight express train tragically crashed just outside of Violet Town. A major community recovery effort ensued, however 9 people sadly lost their lives. There is a memorial dedicated to the people lost and injured and the locals who helped in the aftermath of the disaster.

Today, Violet Town is a thriving community with a friendly atmosphere and creative heart, as evidenced by the colourful welcoming entrance signage designed by the well-known cartoonist, writer, painter and philosopher, **Michael Leunig**, a local of Violet Town.

The famous **Violet Town Community Market** has been held on the second Saturday of each month since 1978 and is one of Victoria's premier markets. With up to 250 stalls each month ranging from fresh produce, arts, crafts, jewellery, local beer and wine, furniture, great coffee and much more, you are sure to find what you are looking for – making a visit to this idyllic town a must!

The Southern Aurora Memorial Park features a train carriage from the original train service of 1969, along with the history of the crash and stories of those who were affected. Browse the history of the area at the Violet Town Museum, or take a relaxing stroll along the Honeysuckle Creek Walking Track.






LOCAL KNOWLEDGE

- The Southern Aurora disaster, rail accident, occurred on 7 February 1969, 1km south of Violet Town. Locals and emergency services did not hesitate to assist survivors of the doomed overnight express service and a memorial garden was created for the 50th anniversary commemoration of this tragedy in 2019.
- Killing Heidi, the Australian rock band, was formed in Violet Town by then locals Ella and Jesse Hooper.
- The local Ellen Frances Hotel burnt down in 1993, after its establishment in 1886. It was rebuilt as it stands today in 1996.
